"A Generous Spirit"

Summer is a time when many are on vacation. As a result, church attendance and giving are often lower than expected. I thought this would be a good time to look at 2 Corinthians Chapter 9 which serves as an excellent resource on stewardship.

In this passage, the Apostle Paul urges the Corinthian believers to excel in the grace of giving. He encourages them to embrace a mindset of abundance and cheerfulness in their generosity, reminding them that God loves a cheerful giver. But why does Paul place such emphasis on giving? Is it merely to sustain the ministry and the Church? No, there is a deeper truth at work here – a truth that speaks to the very core of our relationship with God and our purpose as stewards of His creation.

First and foremost, let us recognize that everything we have, our possessions, resources, and even our very lives, are gifts from God. As recipients of His abundant grace, we are called to respond with a grateful heart. We are entrusted with the responsibility of managing these blessings faithfully, not just for our own benefit, but for the greater good of others and for the advancement of Christ's kingdom.

As stewards, we are called to embrace the spirit of generosity. In verse 6, Paul writes, "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously." This principle of sowing and reaping extends beyond monetary giving. It encompasses our time, talents, and resources – anything we can offer for the glory of God.

The act of giving should never be driven by compulsion or a sense of obligation but by a heartfelt desire to participate in Christ's mission. There may be times when we don't even feel like giving, but the act of giving itself can melt our heart of stone and can cultivate a generous spirit.

Furthermore, as the Holy Spirit cultivates a generous spirit within us, we align ourselves with God's character and purposes. The apostle Paul reminds us that God is able to bless us abundantly so that we can abound in every good work. It is not just about receiving blessings but also about being channels of blessings to others. Our giving has the power to impact lives, transform communities, and advance the Gospel in the world.

Stewardship is not a one-time event or occasional act; it is a way of life. It involves consistently seeking God's guidance in managing all aspects of our lives — our time, talents, finances, and relationships. We are called to live with open hands, ready to share the blessings we have received. In doing so, we become vessels of God's grace and love in a broken world.

As we reflect upon the message of 2 Corinthians 9, let us remember that stewardship is not about what we can get from God, but rather what we can give back to Him and to others. It is a response to the immeasurable grace poured out upon us. May we be inspired to excel in the grace of giving, embracing a spirit of generosity and cheerfulness that reflects the very heart of our gracious God.





An abundance of gifts

In 2022, people set some amazing Guinness World Records. A Nebraska man paddled more than 37 miles in a hollowed-out pumpkin boat. A Vermont teen wearing 4-inch heels walked more than 600 feet across a tightrope. And an Oregon man found and alphabetized all 26 letters in a can of alphabet soup in 2 minutes and 8.6 seconds. (The toughest part, he says, is distinguishing subtle differences between letters such as M and W.)

Your talents might not earn you any world records, but they certainly can grow faith and change lives. Whether you're good at teaching, singing, writing, cooking or accounting, the church can put those skills to productive use. Romans 12 lists many more qualities you may not realize are spiritual gifts: graciousness, serving, generosity, acts of mercy, loving and honoring others, extending hospitality, rejoicing and weeping with people, making peace.

You might not be able to outperform the alphabet soup record. But God abundantly blesses each of us to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10, ESV) and in sharing his love.





A Voters Meeting was held on June 25th after the service. The Call Committee received information on 13 pastors for consideration and have chosen three to be interviewed (probably via Zoom). We HOPE to have a SPECIAL meeting to vote on the candidates on July 9th. NOTE: We will need AT LEAST ONE THIRD of Pilgrim voters present for this vote.

*** Please keep in mind that we may need to go through this process more than once if none of the first three accepts our call. ***

There are many jobs that Pastor Ben and Linda have been doing "behind the scenes". They will provide a list to the church council, so we know what needs to be done. We need to take over those jobs – and BEFORE THEY LEAVE would be a good time!

We voted to hire a part-time church secretary. It would be 10 hours a week at \$15.00 per hour. That is \$150 per week, \$7,800 per year. The secretary will be responsible for typing, printing and folding the weekly bulletin, checking for phone messages, bring in and distribute mail, keep track of office supplies and ordering when needed. This will be a permanent position for any pastor we have.

It was noted that our giving has been DOWN this year. When we vote for a budget, we should be able to meet it. Don't forget to use your envelopes and also make up for the weekends you were not at church. We also have the online feature on Pilgrim's web site. Please keep in mind that we should be able to pay our pastor with an appropriate salary so he can support himself (and his family). This should also include things such as health insurance.


The elders will be in charge of getting a vacancy pastor when possible. We may also have some lay services as well.

The new VBS materials have been received. It will be the same format as last time and will be on the second Sunday of each month. It is scheduled to begin on July 9th.

Outdoor lights on the church will be replaced. (Thanks to Lee Trimmer for doing this.)

Please prayerfully consider serving in one of these capacities: hosting fellowship, counting, altar service, ushering and reading. Please approach someone on the church council.

The next REGULAR meeting will be held on September 17th. The meeting was adjourned, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.

THREE NEW LHM LEARN COURSES FOCUS ON GIFTED FOR MORE

Video interviews with Barna researchers and study developers highlight key findings in the data. Scriptural references reinforce important points, and study questions challenge learners to consider the gifts they possess and how they can use them. Each course is practical and engaging, so learners can jump in and begin to discover, grow, and share their gifts.

Gifted for More is a comprehensive collection of resources that LHM has prepared in concert with Barna Group, a visionary research firm which has conducted more than two million interviews and done tens of thousands of studies. This work has produced an enormous database of spiritual indicators speaking to faith and culture, leadership and vocation, and the changing dynamics of how people live out their faith.

LHM Learn courses come in five FREE faith-strengthening categories: *Christian Foundations, Cultural Concepts, Everyday Insights, Outreach Essentials, and Spiritual Reflections*. Each is perfect for self-study, but there are small group discussion guides available for home or church use, too.
