Mrs. Z. could not see who the object of his spoken affection was and so she quickly made her way to the same corner around which Mr. Z. speedily vanished.

Upon hearing his voice nearby, she stopped at the corner. She could hardly catch her breath and, for fear of what she would find, thought for a moment before she slowly peeked around the building to gaze where her husband could be heard. She did and what she saw could hardly be believed. There wasn't a woman at all, or an animal or anything that you or I would expect. There he was, her husband of many years, watering a tree and speaking fondly to it. He even gave it a hug.

Mrs. Z could not hold herself back. She crashed around the hiding corner and lashed out at her husband with words we don't want to hear. "You scoundrel. What are you doing? All these days you have been leaving me alone at home early in the day to what? Come here? And for what purpose? For this tree? Have you gone mad? Are you not thinking? What will the neighbors think? What am I to think? You have made me sick, thinking that you have been up to something I don't even want to repeat. Explain yourself?"

Well, a startled Mr. Z. could hardly find himself. He never expected his wife to follow him, and now, here she was. So, as soon as he could find the words he explained. "My dear. You need not worry. It's only that this tree has done a great thing for me. You see, a few months ago Jesus of Nazareth came down this street. I knew he would not care to see me because of my way of making a living, but I so wanted to see him. He's famous you know and some even believed that he is the Lord's

Messiah. So, here I was, wanting so much to see him, but I couldn't on account of my stature. I jumped and pushed and even tried to stand on my toes, but I am just too short to see over the crowds.

A Healing Space for At-Risk Children

Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, ND

About This Mission Grant

The Christ-centered, healing ministry of Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch creates an eternal, lifegiving impact in the lives of children, age 10 to 18, who have faced unimaginable trauma. Due to childhood traumas of violence, abuse, neglect, and more, Ranch children experience debilitating emptiness and loneliness at the deepest of levels; levels that only Christ can heal.

A gap in spiritual care on the Ranch's Bismarck campus has been a chapel facility specifically designed to be a healing space for traumatized boys and girls. <u>A construction date of Spring 2024</u> has been set to build a chapel to serve as a healing space to help them know and experience the mercy of Christ and His healing power. This grant will help meet the construction costs of the Chapel on the Bismarck campus and provide healing for at-risk children.



The mission of Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch is to help at-risk children and their families succeed in the name of Christ.



At the Ranch, real ministry happens when children learn to see the world differently, feel the love of God through those who care for them, and begin to look to the future with hope.



Incorporating both trauma-informed design, and the Ranch's "best-in-class" Spiritual Life Programming, this specially designed chapel will be a place where a broken child's heart can find a genuine "home" in God's unfailing promises.



RESPONDING TO A GROWING NEED FOR HISPANIC MINISTRY

In the United States, Hispanics are the second-largest ethnic population. About half of those who identify as Hispanic in the United States today speak Spanish primarily. By 2060, it is expected that Hispanics will constitute more than 27 percent of the American population.

Established to recognize the contributions and influence of Hispanic Americans to the history, culture, and achievements of the United States, Hispanic Heritage Month takes place from September 15 to October 15 each year. September 15 marks the anniversary of the independence of Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September 18, respectively.

As a mass media Gospel outreach organization, LHM is committed to reaching this rapidly growing audience with the Good News of the Gospel. We're doing more than just translating materials written for English-speaking audiences. We're crafting programming and media content *for* Hispanics *by* Hispanics. Below is a glance at LHM's Spanish resources and the impact they have had on individuals in the United States.

Para el Camino (paraelcamino.com)

A Hub for All LHM Spanish Resources

On the **Para el Camino** (For the Journey) website, users will find practical, Christcentered resources to help them successfully manage their daily lives in the United States. Bible-based teaching, sermons, videos, devotionals, and more benefit Christians and non-Christians alike, encouraging them to grow in their knowledge of God and to follow in His footsteps.

The Para el Camino website also offers Daily and Seasonal Devotions, Bible studies, topical **Project Connect** booklets, children's booklets, a radio drama (Ayer, Hoy y Siempre), and links to the Sentido Latino and Vivenciar websites. In addition to the website, Para el Camino has a social media presence that connects people to our resources and provides encouragement.

Impact of Para el Camino

Doris is a faithful reader of our **Daily Devotions**. She called our dedicated 1-800 Spanish line asking for advice since her marriage was falling into pieces. She wanted to do the right thing, but she didn't know how or where to start, and she didn't feel

comfortable talking with her pastor. After a 40-minute conversation and prayer, she had a clearer vision of her situation and a plan to start moving forward.

A listener to the sermons shared, "Thank you for this morning's message. It was very encouraging. It is excellent to see how LHM has invested in Spanish-speaking ministries."

A pastor shared, "This is an exemplary message of the Good News of Jesus Christ for us in this Holy Week. Listen to it, and you will be richly blessed and strengthened in your faith in Christ!"

Sentido Latino (<u>sentidolatino.com</u>) Weekly Podcast

The 15-20-minute weekly podcast's vision and mission are born out in its title. "Sentido Latino" means *Latin sense*, and its tagline, "Donde tu vida tiene sentido," means *where your life makes sense*. The program objective is to raise and discuss issues and values that directly impact U.S. Hispanics' family, spiritual, and community life.

Drawing from a rich and time-honored Christian-Hispanic perspective, program hosts tackle issues with insight and humor, engaging listeners with a lively exchange of good advice and godly wisdom for their journey. In addition to the weekly episodes, Sentido Latino offers a weekly one-minute reflection, downloadable resources, and a growing social media presence that provides encouragement to many.

Impact of Sentido Latino

Berta, a woman from New York, had been listening to our Sentido Latino podcast on healthy boundaries and wanted advice on her relationship. She said she was going through a challenging moment because she found out that her husband was unfaithful to her. She felt like her life had collapsed, and she was at the end of her rope. After talking for a few minutes, we asked if she would like us to pray for her. She said: "Yes, I ask that God would unite my family again... my home is divided. My 14-year marriage is falling to the ground. I don't know how to accept this reality". LHM staff assured her that they would be praying for her and offered to have a local pastor contact her, which she graciously accepted.

Vivenciar (Vivenciar.net)

A Digital Platform Offering Spiritual Guidance to Life's Issues

Pioneered and developed by LHM ministry center staff in the Latin America region, **Vivenciar.net** is a bi-lingual platform that reaches Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking individuals. Since it began in 2017, the purpose of Vivenciar.net has been to start conversations with non-Christians who are looking for help and guidance about relevant topical issues on the internet. Young adults are gravitating to the internet

seeking help, including millions who are curious-or have doubts-about Christianity.

The Vivenciar.net website serves as a hub for digital outreach throughout Latin America and now North America. Through Vivenciar.net, staff and volunteers enter into digital conversations with individuals and provide biblically-based answers for their lives. Since its expansion into the U.S. in 2021, Vivenciar.net has offered help, support, and direction to Spanish-speaking individuals. The live chat, blogs, courses, and e-books give additional support to those seeking answers to their questions.

Impact of Vivenciar.net

Rosa, suffering from terminal cancer, wanted to talk to someone because she was scared and could not find peace. She accepted the invitation to be referred to a pastor, who called her right away. Rosa told him she had heard about Jesus, but she wasn't sure about her salvation or what happens after we die. The pastor patiently and lovingly talked with her about the life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus and what that means for each of us, including her. He also talked about repentance and the forgiveness of sins Jesus provides. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, at the end of the call and after praying, Rosa confessed Jesus as her Lord and Savior. She was assured of her salvation and at peace with herself and with God.

CPTLN Mobile App

The CPTLN (Christ for All Nations) app is a mobile hub for Para el Camino sermons, sermon notes, Daily Devotions, Project Connect booklets, Bible studies, reflections, Vivenciar, a Bible app, and a chat function. This is our first smartphone app entirely in Spanish, with access to all the resources from Para el Camino, Sentido Latino, and Vivenciar. With this app, we offer a convenient way to connect Hispanics to Jesus and to equip them to share the Good News of the Gospel with others.

Hispanics use their phones all the time. When they are working outside the home or otherwise away from a computer, they nevertheless always have access to their phones and can conveniently use our resources on the go. Having the resources on a mobile app gives them access to everything they need without sitting down at a computer.

This afternoon there will be a meeting in the south and north ends of the church. Children will be baptized at both ends.


For those of you who have children and don't know it, we have a nursery downstairs.

Today's Sermon: HOW MUCH CAN A MAN DRINK? With hymns from a full choir.



- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- 3. Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- 5. Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!
